DIRECTORS STATEMENT

When I decided to make "Josef, Markus, Julian", many people said that they liked the script, but that I should rather do something different, more political maybe. I was told that as a son of Turkish immigrants I should be focusing on topics like migration or social injustices, but there couldn't have been a more personal story for me than the one about three generations of men with totally different views on the world. Before my grandfather came to Austria, he was a farmer in Turkey. My dad spent most of his life in Vienna and can barely remember his childhood on his dad's farm. I was born in Vienna and only know Turkey from summer vacations. This lack of connection made me think about my past and the responsibility I have towards it. It's a universal conflict that all of us have to deal with and a reason why I don't want to be in vogue.

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
